# About the 2025 conference

Platform governance continues to grow in importance and intellectual vibrancy as an interdisciplinary field of research. A changing mix of competing platform companies faced with various efforts to regulate, influence, or control them and their offers has become an ever more central feature of many societies. As monolithic services begin to fracture and decentralized platform infrastructures, some governments assert their power and authority, and new constellations of actors emerge, we witness more than mere technical transitions and instead realignments in the political economy of platforms and societies. These changes manifest through multiple frictions across state, market, and civil society - between digital sovereignty and transnational platform operations, established market leaders and nascent alternatives, context and consistency, regulatory intent and practice, and between pragmatic appraisals and normative aspirations. Understanding these transitions demand empirical analysis and may require new conceptual and methodological approaches.

# Keynote conversation I Aline Riera Founder of Señoritas Courier

With a degree in Fine Arts and a master's degree in Visual Poetics from the University of São Paulo, Aline Riera is the founder of the collective, cooperative and association <u>Señoritas Courier</u>, made up of women and transgender people. She is a biker courier and cycloactivist. Currently she speaks and researches about care-based algorithms, their development and application in work platforms.

Collectively, she addresses the importance of digital inclusion to enable workers to appropriate the means to develop solutions for decent work, with an eye on Platform Cooperativism. She is a member of research groups on new labor relations, such as Worker Owned Intersectional Platforms - WOIP (University of Toronto), the Institute for Advanced Studies - IEA (University of São Paulo) and the Platform-Work Inclusion Living Lab - P-WILL (Cost Action). She participated as the only woman, the only delivery cyclist and the only cooperative representative in the Working Group for the regulation of platform work of the Ministry of Labor and Employment, throughout 2023.

Ashooh also spent time earlier in her career in Erbil, Iraq working as a consultant to the Kurdistan Regional Government's Minister of Planning. She is a life member of the Council on Foreign Relations and holds a doctorate in international relations from the University of Oxford (St. Antony's College), which she attended as a Marshall Scholar. Dr. Ashooh did her undergraduate studies at Brown University and also spent time at the American University of Beirut and at the Bourguiba Language Institute in Tunis. 
